Mikis Theodorakis

Michael (Mikis) Theodorakis was born in Chios on July 29, 1925. He is one of the most important modern Greek composers. At the same time, he was a politician, a former minister, a four-time member of the Greek Parliament and an activist honored with the Peace Prize of Lenin (1983).

He has dealt with all kinds of music and has composed the perhaps more recognizable Greek rhythm internationally, the "Zorbas" (1964), based on traditional Cretan music. He has also dealt with classical music by writing symphonies, oratorios, ballets, opera and chamber music. His compositions have been interpreted by world-famous artists such as Beatles, Sirla Busei and Edith Piaf, and has written music for well-known films such as: 1962), Alexis Zorbas (1964), Z (1969) and Serpico (1973). He was also awarded the BAFTA Award for Original Music for Film in 1970, while he was a 1974 candidate for the State of Siege and 1975 for Serpico. He was also a candidate for Grammy in 1966 and 1975 for the musical theme of the films Zorbas and Serpico respectively. However, his most

important work is the melodious poetry, namely the folk music composition, using as poems poems of award-winning poets of Greek and foreign origin, such as Giorgos Seferis (Nobel 1963), Pablo Neruda (Nobel 1971), Odysseas Elytis (Nobel 1979). With the imposition of the Dictatorship of 21 April 1967, a long period of persecution and exile for the composer will begin, ending in 1970 with the amnesty granted to him after an international outcry. During the period of the Transition, he will be widely accepted and his music will can be heard again freely. It will become a reference point for a new period for Greece and at the same time it will remain a symbol for many countries' fighters against totalitarian regimes. 2000 is a Nobel Peace Prize. In his sixty-year career, Mikis Theodorakis wrote all kinds of music: opera, symphonic music, chamber music, oratorios, ballet, choral ecclesiastical music, music for ancient drama, theater, cinema, folk song, post-symphonic works. has written many books that have been translated into several languages. He is one of the most important and most discussed person

hope nothing, I am not afraid of anything, I am free".

Nikos Kazantzakis was born in Heraklion, Crete on 2 February 1883, and died in the German city of Freiburg on 26 October 1957.

A novelist, philosopher, journalist, poet and playwright, Nikos Kazantzakis is considered to be one of the most important writers of the 20th century. Kazantzakis is a prolific, truly tireless working writer. He became known to many people with his novels, the fruit of his mature writing, but he has dealt with all kinds. As a journalist he has written interviews from all over the world, he has interviewed Mussolini, Franco, Rivera, Unanymo, saw his articles published in the Bolshevik Pravda. As a poet has written the greatest contemporary epic, his Odyssey in 33333 verses. A public official attempted to repatriate 150000 Caucasian Greeks to the troubled years of the October Revolution. As a translator he translated from Homer to Pirandello. He translated Dante's Divine Comedy into Greek lyrics in 45 days. As a philosopher, he saw his Ascetic deservedly a place among the works of great intellectuals. As a novelist, he saw

his works translate into more than fifty languages, and he enjoyed making films with worldwide success and unrest. From Zorba Cacoyannis to Scorsese's Last Temptation. He has been nominated for nine years for the Nobel Prize with a total of fourteen proposals, but he did not take it because the troubled years were not supported as much as they could from official Greece. Man is accused as anarchist, communist, a nationalist, an atheist, a religious, a chauvinist, a half-son, a nihilist. The Greek Church wanted to apologize for his work The Last Temptation, but he did not dare to proceed to that, as the ecumenical Patriarch Athenagoras opposed it. In June 1957, after his trip to China, a guest of the Chinese government, got sick with leukemia! He was hospitalized in Copenhagen, Denmark and Freiburg, Germany, where he died on October 26, 1957, at the age of 74. At the tomb of Nikos Kazantzakis in Heraklion, Crete, the inscription: "I hope nothing, I am not afraid of anything, I am free".

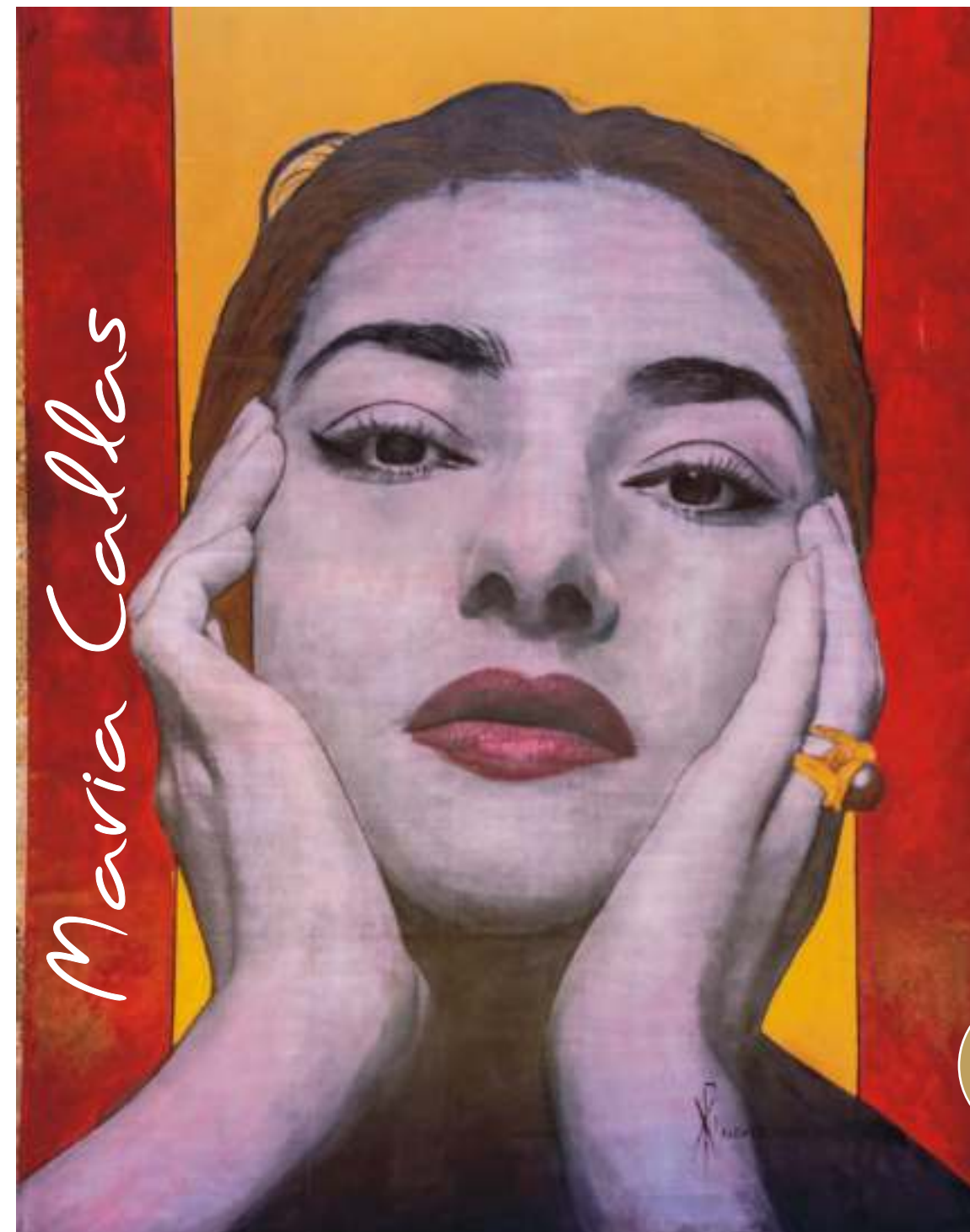


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Maria Callas

Maria Callas, the leading Greek-American singer and world-famous opera diva, is born in New York on 2 December 1923 and dies in Paris on September 16, 1977.

From early on, he is involved in music and at the age of 11 he earns the first prize in a children's voice contest in America! When she is teenage her parents divide and move with her mother and her sister in Greece! In February 1941, at the age of 18, she made her professional debut at the stage of Lyric of the then Royal Theater, interpreting the small role of Beatrice Franz Von Suppe. To 1945 he returned to New York to promote her international career. Things are not easy, but not disappointed! In Verona she knows her husband, Giovanni Battista

Meneghini, a craftsman in the profession, with the help of which her career takes off! Milan's Scala and the New York Metropolitan Opera are bowing to the Maria Callas phenomenon, but in 1959 he knows Aristotle Onassis, his great unfulfilled love her life. She wants a divorce from her husband to marry Onassis, but this is never the case, as in July 1968 the Greek tycoon married the American widow of Kennedy. This is the act of depressing the top horn. She closes her apartment in Paris and herself. He leaves life in bitterness and only in the morning of September 16, 1977, from a heart attack at the age of 54.

THE ALIVE CARYATID

Irene Papa, a beautiful creature that moved with grandeur and grace and looked like a live caryatid, was born on September 3, 1926. It is one of the most emblematic forms of Greece with worldwide recognition that shone on the theatrical plaque and cinema!

Her first steps in the theater take place through participation in ancient tragedies, such as "Medea" and "Electra". She has almost 80 films in her hands! Her debut in cinema makes it in 1948 with the film "Lost Angels". One of her best known performances is the role of Maria Papadimou in the "Navarone Canons" in 1961 and the role of the widow in the film "Life and the State of Alexis Zorbas" in the film transfer of the work of Nikos Kazantzakis. In 1962 he collaborates with Michalis Kakogiannis in the cinematic transfer of Electra. This film wins 24 awards at the Cannes Film Festival. She

participates in many Hollywood productions and starred in the Brondwell Theater. Three of the films she starred in are nominated for an Oscar-winning film with French-language "Z" by Costas Gavras, while Candidates and two Greek films, "Electra" and "Iphigenia". Today she lives in Athens. Even now that she has retired from the theatrical events, her name is top and her performances are a subject of acting for the younger actors. Irene Papa is the power of the ancient tragedy that represented the Greek civilization in all lengths and widths of the earth. It is no accident that Pope Benedict invites her to the Sistine Chapel to convey the message of God with her art!

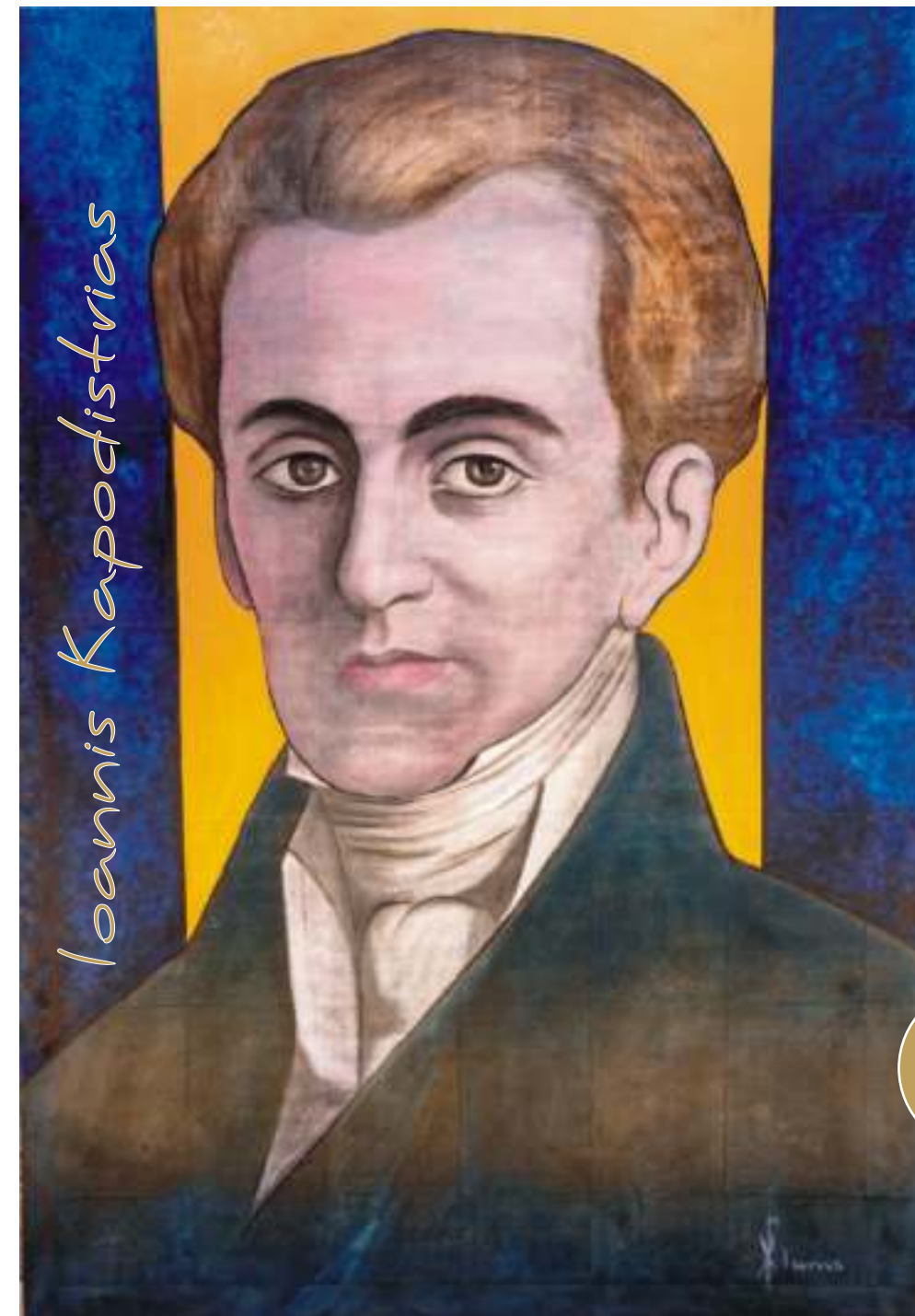


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Ioannis Kapodistrias

The first governor of Greece

(February 10, 1776 - September 27, 1831)

Ioannis Kapodistrias, a Greek diplomat and politician, came from a noble family of Corfu with a political tradition!

He studied medicine, philosophy and law at the University of Padua, Italy. In 1809 he entered the diplomatic service of the Russian Empire, at the invitation of tsar Alexander I, after having served as governor of the Ionian state. After great diplomatic success, the Tsar was appointed Minister of Foreign Affairs of Russia from 1816 to 1822. A great personality in the European diplomatic chessboard, before coming to Greece, left his footsteps deep and in another country, Switzerland. In fact, Ioannis Kapodistrias founded and organized modern Switzerland. He was the instigator of Swiss neutrality and the man who managed to annex the cantons of Geneva and Lausanne to the Swiss federation. The administrative system that he

introduced at that time is still the basis of the Swiss government. On March 30, 1827, the Trizina National Assembly elected him the governor of the newly established Greek state. He arrived in Nafplio on January 7, 1828 and was welcomed with cheers and enthusiastic events by the people. The new governor immediately carried out the task of creating a state from scratch and incarnated with his governmental virtues the regenerative effort of national emancipation of our homeland. However, his policies have also caused many dislikes because he opposed the interests of large families, resulting in his murder on the morning of September 27, 1831. For his assassination, the Swiss philhellene IG Edinard wrote: "He who murdered Kapodistrias murdered his homeland. His Death is a disaster for Greece and a European accident."



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Manos Chatzidakis

Greatest musical genius of Greece

born on 23 October 1925 in Xanthi

From the age of four he starts piano lessons, while violin and accordion are taught.

His childhood is marked by the separation of his parents and the death of his father in an air crash a few years later. The start of World War II finds him in Athens. He is the first composer to perform in 1944 at the age of 19 with his participation in the project "The Last Asprokorakas". He follows a period of intense creative action where the work In 1961 he won the Academy Award for Best Original Song for the song "The Children of Piraeus". This award gives him worldwide publicity that Hatzidakis tries to avoid in any way, considering that he is deprived of the opportunity to form his own relationship with his listener. "For me, the Oscar is not a career flaw, but my true start" is the composer's statement. In 1966, he was visiting New York to Broadway with Jules Dessen and Melina

Mercury on the Broadway with his theatrical adaptation of "Never Sunday" titled "Illya Darling". He will stay there for six years. In 1972 he returns to Greece. This period, until the end of his life, is considered to be the most mature and creative in his musical career and is marked by the recording of the project "The Great Erotic" and the foundation of the "Orchestra of Colors", which presents in a novel way works classical and contemporary composers! Manos Hatzidakis leaves life on June 15, 1994, unique, genius and petty man.

The global musical genius

Vangelis Papathanasiou, known internationally as Vangelis, is the most famous Greek music composer in the world and is very much awarded for his contribution to the music industry. His talent captivated and continues to capture millions of fans around the world!

Born on 29 March 1943 in Agria, Volos. He starts composing from the age of 4, being self-taught! Growing up studying classical music, painting and directing at the Academy of Fine Arts in Athens. He has influenced the development of different musical genres and he is considered as the forerunner of electronic sound. He has invested a number of musicals and Oscar-winning music for the film *The Streets of Fire* 1982. In 1997 he directs the opening ceremony of the 6th IAAF World Athletics Championship held at the Athens

Panathenaic Stadium. His work "Mythodia" was selected by NASA as the Official music to send "2001 Mars Odyssey". Two years later he honors him with the public contribution medal in recognition of his outstanding contribution to her vision! This award is the highest honor from the American organization for non-governmental persons. As a tribute to its music offer and to its love for space, the Minor Planet Center of the International Astronomical Union gave the name of Vangelis Papathanasiou to the Asteroid of the Lord Zone 6354. Now called 6354 Vangelis.



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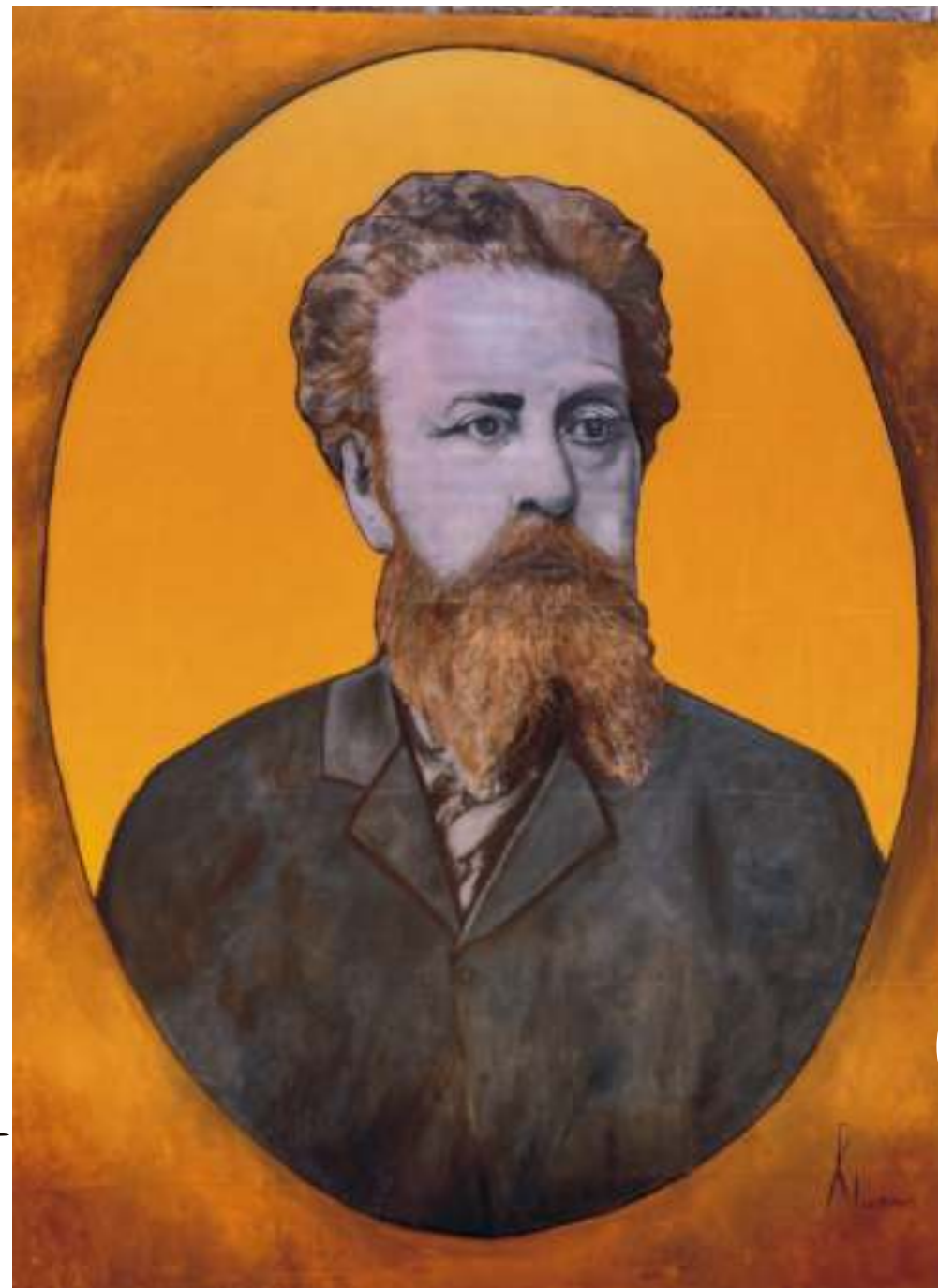
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Nikolaos Doukas



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Nikolaos Doubas

Nikolaos Doubas was born in Vienna on July 24, 1830 and died in the 23rd of March 1900. He was a Greek-Austrian, Vlach-born, benefactor and entrepreneur.

During his life, he made several donations, including the construction of the Viennese Concert Hall, next to which is a street named after him (Dumbastrasse). He was a personal friend of Richard Wagner and Johann Strauss. In his country house, on the banks of the Danube, Straus composed and introduced the well-known waltz of the Blue Danube. The Douba palace, the palace of the Douba family, was a meeting place for the artistic and spiritual world of the imperial capital of Austro-Hungarian Empire. Nikolaos Doubas was considered to be the one who contributed to becoming famous. He kept the greatest collection of works of the composer, prevented their dispersion and

destruction, and he decisively contributed to the projection and study of his material, as he bequeathed 200 autographs of the composer in the City of Vienna. Anton Kral composed his work "Dumba Marsch". Nikolaus Dumba also dealt with politics: he was elected to the Lower House, was a member of the Analogue Austro-Hungarian Delegation in 1874, a senior senator in the Upper House, and for a long time he was secretly the emperor of the emperor. He was the rapporteur of the Foreign Affairs budget of the Empire. He founded the Laiki Bank of Vienna. Throughout his life he offered financial support to schools in his ancestral lands. For his enormous contribution to culture, the Austrian state described him as the "Maquis of the Arts" and his name was drawn in the "Gold Book" of Honorary Citizens of Vienna.

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Aristotelis Onassis

Aristotle Onassis was a Greek shipowner and entrepreneur and one of the most famous "crowns" of the 20th century. Born in Smyrna on January 20, 1906. In 1922 he was forced to leave Smyrna with his family because of the Asia Minor disaster and to go to Greece!

In 1923, with \$ 250 in pocket, he migrated to Argentina. The beginning of his new life was quite difficult, with Onassis doing various footwork until he was recruited as a night operator by the British Telephony Company. There, taking advantage of conversations he was hiding, he decided to set up a small tobacco import and cigarette manufacturing business. The cigarette business went well and, taking advantage of the economic circumstances, turned to a sector that the Greeks have always had a special appeal: shipping. So in 1932 he bought his first ship. In 1946 he married the daughter of Stavros Livanos, Athena - Tina, and acquired two children, Alexandros and Christina. Although marriage did not last, Onassis became one of the largest shipowners in the world, mainly in the field of oil tankers. In 1956, Aristotle founded Olympic Airways while in 1963 he bought

Scorpios, a small and barren island in the Ionian Sea. which transformed into a terrestrial paradise. Meanwhile, in 1957 he met Maria Callas, with whom he developed a stormy love affair for Onassis women were mainly another trophy for his collection. And at the end of the 1960s, no "trophy" could shine more strongly in his eyes than the charming widow of US assassinated president, John Kennedy. So, on October 20, 1968, at the church of Scorpio, Onassis married Jacqueline Bouvier or Jacqueline Kennedy for a second time in a marriage that left history! On January 24, 1973, Onassis's son, Alexander, was killed in a plane crash at the age of 25 years. His premature death brought Aristotle Onassis a heavy blow, which he never met! He died two years later, on March 15, 1975, at the American Hospital of Neigy, near Paris, suffering from acute myasthenia.

«BORN GREEK»

Melina Merkouri, October 18, 1920 - March 6, 1994, lives a passionate and loving life and leaves time with its unbelievable charm and its rare temperament! He studied theater and collaborates with leading names of Greek and world art, such as Michalis Cacoyannis, Romy Schneider, Lawrence Olivier, Mano Hadjidakis, etc.

Her first film work is Michalis Cakoyiannis's film "Stella" (1955), while Ilia's role in "Never Never Sunday" (1960) gains international fame, the first female performance at the Cannes Film Festival, and also nominated for Oscar, which she lost to Elizabeth Taylor. In 1965 she marries the American director, Zil Dassen, and her career takes off,

when she is dictatorial in Greece and is struggling to overthrow her, using her fame and glamor in her Outside! the restoration of the Republic, returns to Greece. He is elected Member of Parliament and assumes the role of Minister of Culture. His vision is the return of the Parthenon marbles from the British Museum. He says: "If you ask me if I will live when the Parthenon marbles return to Greece, I tell you how, I will live! But if I do not live yet, I will be reborn. "Melina's star disappears on March 6, 1994.



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
